Erie County Bicentennial

Two hundred years ago, on April 2, 1821, Erie County was created from what had been the very large county of Niagara. By the census of 1820, the population of the whole of Niagara County was 23,313, of which 15,668 were in the present county of Erie. These numbers were considered sufficient to justify a division.


The celebration of Erie County's Bicentennial will last for a full year—April 2, 2021 to April 2, 2022. A whole year is needed to honor and reflect on our County and the area's history. The expanded window of time also offers a higher chance for in-person activities and foundations for on-going legacy projects.

The County Planning Committee has been meeting for more than two years and has come up with themes such as Arts & Culture, Agriculture, Industry, Education and Enjoy Winter for each month of the celebration year. Programming is being planned with the understanding of the current pandemic restrictions and guidelines established by New York Forward and the Erie County Department of Health. From self-guided tours to virtual programs, there will be opportunities for all to participate in the programs and activities.

Christopher Gust and I have been working with Clarence, Lancaster, Newstead and Elma Historical Societies on a passport program that will encourage Erie County residents to visit the historical societies and museums in the county from now until the end of the year. There are many interesting stories to be learned and enjoyed.

With "Shining a Light on the History of Erie County" as our theme, a suggestion I made, you will use your passport to guide you to the historical societies from the Tonawandas to Concord where you will search for a numbered lantern among the displays and have your passport stamped to verify your visit.



Curator's Corner

A few weeks ago, a package arrived at the Heritage Center. It contained an extremely cute football jersey from Alden Junior Football. Steve Mankowski sent it to us. The package contained a letter from him that told of his early involvement with the Historical Soci-

ety courtesy of Henrietta Henskee. At one time, he was our youngest member. Henrietta also was responsible for getting him to work at the Genesee County museum in 1981. It was there that he learned the art of blacksmithing from Jeff Gulenvilla. Steve says that 40 years later, he is still at that craft. He spent 30 years as a blacksmith at Colonial Williamsburg and is presently working with



the archeologists at Historic Jamestown Island. He also blacksmiths at Preservation Virginia. Steve has his own forge called Pine Tree Forge.

I understand that Steve returned to Alden some time ago to give a presentation on blacksmithing to the Society.

Steve ends his letter by thanking the Alden Historical Society for "giving him the spark back in 1976 to pursue his life in teaching history." For anyone interested, he is a member of Facebook. 2
